Secretary Perdue,

Thank you for your leadership in helping Florida citrus recover in the aftermath of Hurricane Irma. As you saw during your visit just a week after this catastrophic act of God hit our state, the damage to Florida's citrus growing region was widespread and extensive with roughly 80% of the industry impacted by this historic event.

As you are aware, Hurricane Irma was a devastating blow to an industry already struggling from the impacts of Citrus Greening making the need for timely relief critical. Unfortunately, seventeen months after Hurricane Irma, the vast majority of the disaster assistance provided by Congress has yet to get into the hands of producers. Governor Ron DeSantis and Director Jared Moskowitz have done an excellent job prioritizing the distribution of Block Grant dollars at the state level. However, our research has shown the processing time for WHIP payments through the Farm Service Agency offices continues to be an issue. This in turn delays the State's ability to process Citrus Recovery Block Grant applications in a timely manner. This situation was only exacerbated by the federal shutdown with Florida's citrus growers caught in the middle.

Further, there are several outstanding issues pertaining to the interaction between the WHIP program and the State Block Grant as well as policy decisions on the requirements of the Block Grant that need resolution by the USDA. The response to these concerns have been slow to materialize. Any assistance you could provide in bolstering the resources available to expedite
